COMMUNITY

Bronxville is an incorporated village in the town of Eastchester, Westchester County, New York. Located 15 miles north of midtown New York City, it is a residential community of 6500 people. The Bronxville School District is coterminous with the one-mile square village area. The community has traditionally supported public education, and in May residents approved a school budget of \$52,797,532 for the 2023-2024 school year. The total district enrollment is 1,571 students K-12 and the annual per pupil expenditure is \$33,606.

Project based learning units, technology-enhanced lessons, sustained attention to writing development, access to online courses, redesigned classroom spaces and attention to growth in leadership in all areas of activity, support this endeavor.

SCHOOL

Bronxville High School is a public four-year college preparatory school, nationally recognized for educational excellence. Current enrollment is 524 students in grades 9-12, with a senior class of 118 students. Approximately 98% of graduates attend four year colleges. Thirteen students attend Bronxville's Life Skills program, a specialized pre-vocational program for students with developmental disabilities. School accreditation is through the Tri-States Association of Secondary Schools and Colleges and The New York State Education Department. The teaching faculty consists of approximately 60 full and part-time teachers, all of whom hold a minimum of a Master's Degree. As of the '23-'24 school year, one counselor works with the entire 9th grade. Three counselors, including the director, each work comprehensively with students in grades 10-12 for three years. The school calendar consists of four 9 week grading periods, with 80-minute alternating block academic class periods on a 6 day rotation.

UNIQUE COURSE OFFERINGS

Bronx River Research students use our local river as an outdoor laboratory to formulate their own research questions and attempt to answer them through a series of lab-based investigations. Students focus on scientific methods, data analysis, and science communication, including learning how to find, read, and use peer-reviewed research in their own projects. Results of studies are shared widely, with middle school classes, school administrators, land managers, and city government so that students can use science to better their community.

Research Seminar in Education Equity examines the philosophical and structural purposes of education in the United States, and its ensuing issues. Students study the broad purpose and execution of education in the US through various methodologies, including introduction to rigorous philosophical and cornerstone texts studied in teacher education programs at the college level, Supreme Court case studies and various research in the field. This class requires students to write a capstone paper on a topic related to an issue in education, and complete the research, proposal, writing and revision process throughout the entirety of the first semester. Students are required to develop a set of research questions within a narrow scope, interact with the published professional and academic literature, as well as how the media and society engages with their chosen topic.

Artificial Intelligence independent Study (IND AI), students learn the basics of the Python programming language, including functions and iteration. Students study natural language processing (NLP) and the implementation of AI in situations involving written text. The class also creates applications that use advanced AI concepts like linear regression, logistic regression, and neural networks. Students also discuss the ethics of AI and its applications, in terms of bias in the data it is trained on and privacy issues associated with collecting this data.

ACADEMICS

English, Social Studies and most Science courses are taught at Honors (H) level. Some students follow a traditional college preparatory NYS regents level study.

Enrollment in AP classes is subject to prerequisites, teacher and departmental recommendation; however a waiver policy is in place for those highly motivated students who do not meet the criteria.

Service Learning Seminar is a new research and community service course. Seniors can do semester long career internships in WISE.

Independent study and independent research are encouraged. This year approximately 65 students will investigate a topic of interest under the supervision of a teacher (IND).
